
- 324 community conversations


Throughout August and September, our community had the opportunity to attend one of 17 separate Drop-In sessions held at:


How important to you and your family is open space for recreation?

47% of respondents say they visit weekly


38% of respondents say they visit daily




Who do you visit a park with?

Community Feedback

Aligning with the new Council Plan, below is some feedback received from the Community Conversations & Surveys.



- Improve local path connections to reserves, schools, and community facilities with safe crossings and accessible design.
- Ensure adequate lighting, signage, and accessibility upgrades for prams, wheelchairs, and scooters.
- Increase safety through lighting and CCTV in priority locations
- Maintain open spaces that support a sense of security
- Community support for more walking and cycling paths



- Encourage more free community events, festivals and cultural activities in open spaces
- Support tourism through improved signage, pathways and activations of key precincts
- Spaces for cultural experiences and community gatherings



- Expand supporting amenities eg. drinking fountains, picnic tables, shaded seating and family friendly facilities
- Expand recreational facilities including outdoor gyms, dog parks, nature based play, risky play
- Call for more inclusive spaces and facilities for young people, seniors and all abilities
- Improved waste management in open spaces eg. Litter Bins



- Enhance natural areas through tree planting, weed management, and habitat protection along creeks and waterways
- Increased biodiversity across spaces, with more trees and native plants
- Emphasis on open-air environments that provide escape from urban sprawl
